Nature-based early childhood education teaches young children to care for and interact with the natural environment. The social, emotional and practical skills that are acquired in this environment are life-long skills that can successfully guide children and enrich lives into the future.

Nature play is often child-led. Fostering freedom, creativity and inquiry based learning.

Children learn about the seasons, animals and plants, biodiversity and undertake problemsolving exercises that naturally incorporate maths, science and engineering skills.

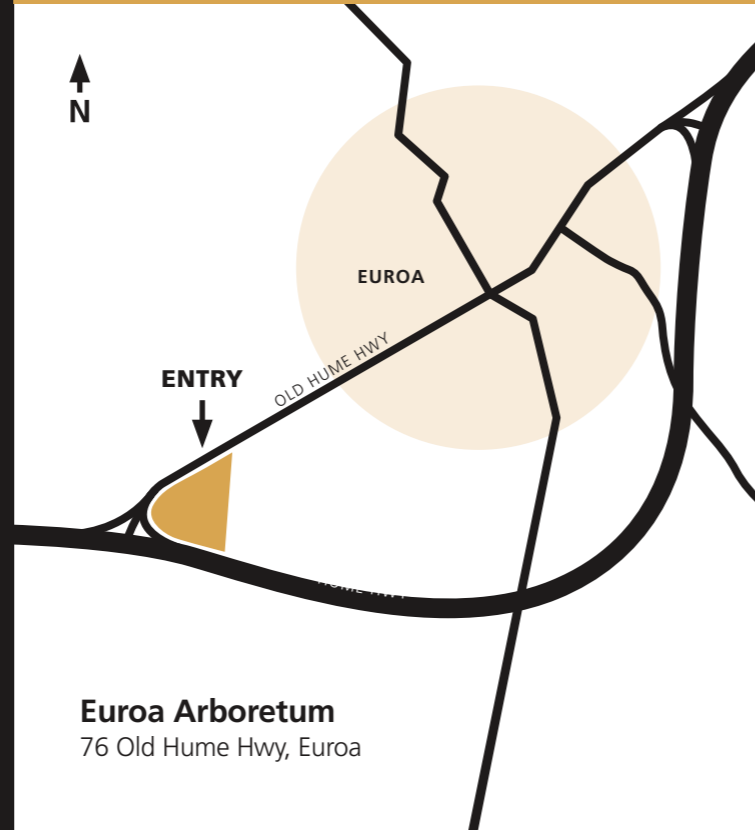
Children take risks, learn the benefits of persistence and have the freedom to play individually or together.

Teachers and parents often note the therapeutic nature of bush kinder, observing calmer and more focused children.

When children begin, some say they are bored or even scared and often experience a transformation, becoming more confident, capable and content over the year.

SUMMER
